


We're broadening the funding base

We've established a governance model

 Fedora is governed by a Leadership group and a Steering group

Fedora Governance Model



Governance benefits

Level of contribution	Benefit
\$2,500	Contributors can nominate and elect one contributor at the \$2,500 tier to join the Leadership Group
\$5,000	Contributors can nominate and elect two contributors at the \$5,000 tier to join the Leadership Group
\$10,000	Contributors can nominate and elect four contributors at the \$10,000 tier to join the Leadership Group
\$20,000	Contributors guaranteed one seat on the Leadership Group
0.5 FTE Developer	Contributors guaranteed one seat on the Leadership Group



Migration tools

Tools for migrating from Fedora 3 to 4

- migration-utils (generic + Islandora)
- fedora-migrate (Hydra)

We need community input, testing, and validation

Portland Common Data Model

Flexible, extensible data model

- Defines collections, objects, and files
- Encourages linked data best practices

Promotes interoperability

· Currently being adopted by Hydra and Islandora

Audit Service

Maintains a history of events for each repository resource

· Uses existing event system and an external triplestore

Designed and implemented via community participation



- I. Complete Upgration pilots by end of April
- 2. Release next major 4.x by OR2015

Release focus:

- Support Fedora 3.x to 4.x migrations
- Polish Fedora 4.0 edges

- Need at least 2 developers per sprint
