


- <u>Easier upgrading to 5.x from any previous DSpace version (1.x.x, 3.x or 4.x)</u> Your underlying DSpace database now upgrades itself automatically when you first run a newer version of DSpace. Solr/Lucene indexes upgrade automatically during the "ant update" step.
- Perform Batch Imports from Administrative UI (XMLUI or JSPUI)
- <u>REST API</u> now supports CRUD (Create/Read/Update/Delete
- <u>Linked (Open)</u> via a new RDF interface
- OAI-PMH improvements, including OpenAIRE v3 compliance
- Enhanced Image and PDF Thumbnails using ImageMagick / Ghostscript
- File downloads now tracked in <u>Google Analytics</u> (when enabled)
- Enhancements to <u>DOI support</u> (EZID IdentifierProvider Metadata Mapping)
- Provide a place for third-party plugins/JARs to be discovered by DSpace (plugin.classpath)
- All DSpaceObjects now have underlying metadata support

XMLUI-specific:

- Mirage 2 responsive theme, based on <u>Bootstrap</u>
- ORCID integration
- Report Google Analytics statistics in Admin UI
- Autogenerate PDF citation cover pages for all PDFs
- Sherpa/Romeo lookup during item submission
- Rendering MathML code in abstracts using MathJax (see <u>DS-635</u>)

JSPUI-specific:

- Drag and drop file upload (using HTML5) in Submission Process (see <u>DS-1994</u>)
- Item visual indicators in browse and search results



Governance



Planning

- 1. 2013-2014 DSpace "Vision" Discussions
- 2. August to December 2014 DCAT held a series of calls to develop use cases
- 3. March to May 2015 Consultant (James Evans, Open Repository) develops draft roadmap
- 4. June 2015 Draft roadmap presented to DSpace community at Open Repositories Conference
- 5. Summer 2015 Roadmap approved and work begins to implement it



Issues

- 1. Software is somewhat dated and needs some additional features
- 2. Two user interfaces XMLUI or JSPUI
- Broad, diverse and international user, committer, service provider and membership base is difficult to coordinate
- 4. Need to develop a roadmap and a strategy for focusing software development on the roadmap priorities
