





Tools for migrating from Fedora 3 to 4

- <u>migration-utils</u> (generic + Islandora)
- <u>fedora-migrate</u> (Hydra)

We need more community input, testing, and validation

Portland Common Data Model

Flexible, extensible data model

- Defines collections, objects, and files
- Encourages linked data best practices

Promotes interoperability

 Currently being adopted by Hydra, Islandora and custom installations

WebAccessControl

Optional authorization delegate

Implements W3C WebAC standard

Designed and (will be) implemented via community participation
